#### **Prayer of the week**

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, we want to follow you wherever you lead. Help us follow you. Reach out to us this day, stirring our souls and spirits with the winds of your power that we may faithfully be your disciples. Help us leave our excuses behind and choose to follow you. Amen!

Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God. —Luke 9:62

In today's Gospel text, Jesus resolutely travels to Jerusalem, and, ultimately, toward the cross. Along the way, he encounters several people...some who refuse to welcome him and others who desire to follow him— but only after they take care of some personal business. Jesus' response: no excuses. The work is urgent. There is no looking back. We must be focused. The time is now. It strikes me that when we are working in line with what God has planned for us...when we are listening and following with the same focus and determination that Jesus demonstrated, then there are no limits to what can be accomplished through us.

We are called to move >> out!...armed with Jesus' love, focused on furthering Christ's kingdom, determined to not be distracted by the world and everything in it...

#### Monday: Jesus Set His Face to Go to Jerusalem

During Jesus' earthly ministry, he moved toward the cross with resolution and purpose. It is so important to remember that God, since the time of the Fall, intended for Jesus to die. Read Luke 9:51; John 12:27; 2 Timothy 1:9; and 1 Peter 1:18-20. What does this say about God's amazing love? Think about the events in Jesus' life and ministry; ponder the love, compassion, and mercy he demonstrated. Remember that his destination was the cross. Consider his resolute, laser-like focus. Ask the Spirit what you might learn from Jesus' example.

#### **Tuesday: Look at Jesus!**

Read John 1:1-14; Luke 9:51-62; Philippians 2:6-8; 1 John 1:1-2; and Revelation 1:12-18. Look at Jesus: true God and true man; despised, rejected, persecuted, crucified; risen, exalted, mighty, glorious, and transcendent. Those who encounter Jesus in the Luke 9 text see the man: prophet, healer, and teacher. James and John had seen Jesus' glory at the Transfiguration (9:28-36), and they seem eager for a display of his power (9:54). We worship the resurrected and exalted Jesus; we see glimpses of his eternal glory (Revelation 1), yet are we more willing to follow Jesus than those in the Luke 9 text? Can we say "no" or "wait" to Jesus? Tell Jesus you will follow him.

#### Wednesday: "But...Lord"

Think about it: if Jesus is truly Lord, and he is, do we have any right, any justification, for saying, "but...Lord"? Read Luke 9:51-62 and notice the responses to Jesus: the Samaritans reject him because they don't like his agenda; we don't know how the three men (9:57-62) ultimately respond, but, initially, we see roadblocks to full discipleship. What are they? Consider that the father (9:59-60) might not even have been near death. Do we sometimes tell Jesus, "when... happens, then I will"? Do we give lip service to discipleship, but waver in our commitment to follow Jesus? Have an honest conversation with Jesus about what it means to follow him.

#### Thursday: I Will Follow Jesus

Read Luke 9:57-62. Does Jesus promise that being his followers will be easy? Just what does he promise? Consider Matthew 5:11-12; John 8:34-36; 10:10; 13:12-17; 14:1-3; 15:9-20; 16:33; and Acts 1:8. What else are we promised in Romans 8:31-39? Think about the freedom we have in Christ: freedom from sin and death; freedom to live abundant, joyful, purposeful lives, knowing we are loved and have an eternal inheritance. Tell Jesus you want to trust him enough to follow him wholeheartedly. He is worthy.

## Friday: Move from Complacency to Discipleship: Follow Jesus!

In order to plough in a straight line, a farmer must fix their eyes on a distant spot and stay focused on it. Jesus draws a parallel and tells us we must make a decision to follow him, without delay and without being deterred. Read Matthew 6:33; 13:44-46; Luke 9:57-62; Philippians 1:21; 3:13-14; 4:12-13; and Hebrews 12:1-2. Consider again Jesus' resolute focus (Luke 9:51; Hebrews 12:1-2) and our call to fix our eyes on Jesus and follow him. Following Jesus means being a servant; it is purposeful, passionate, joyful, abundant, and sacrificial living. Pray the words of the folk hymn: "I have decided to follow Jesus...no turning back, no turning back!"

#### **Saturday: Take My Life**

Read Mark 12:29-31; Luke 9:51-62; Romans 12:1-2; and Revelation 2:4; 3:15-16. Pray for the desire to follow Jesus whole-heartedly; ask the Spirit to teach you what it means to live for Jesus. Pray Frances Havergal's lyrics: "Take my life and let it be consecrated, Lord, to Thee; take my moments and my days; let them flow in ceaseless praise. Take my hands and let them move at the impulse of Thy love...Take my silver and my gold, not a mite would I withhold. Take my intellect and use ev'ry pow'r as Thou shalt choose. Take my will and make it Thine...Take my heart; it is Thine own; it shall be Thy royal throne...Take myself and I will be ever, only, all for Thee."
