You are salt. You are light.

But what happens when you don't feel very bright? What about the days when faith feels small, patience runs thin, or you become painfully aware of the ways you have failed to love?

This week's daily devotions take us deeper into Jesus' words from Matthew 5 and Paul's reminder in Ephesians 5: "Now you are light in the Lord."

Each day explores what it means to live as salt and light—not by trying harder to earn God's love, but by beginning again with what Christ has already done for us. We will reflect on forgiveness, staying connected to Jesus, putting on love, and trusting God to work through the small and ordinary things we do.

Take a few minutes each day this week to read, reflect and pray.

You may discover that being salt and light is not about doing something spectacular. Sometimes it is simply allowing the love you have received from Jesus to shine into the life of the person right beside you.

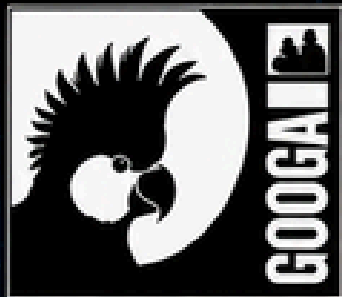

‘WE ARE IN THE LORD’S SERVICE’

Under a vast desert sky, stories of faith are still being told. Around campfires and under tin-roofed shelters, voices rise in prayer and song - in Arrarnta, Anmatyerr, Alyawarr, Luritja and Pitjantjatjara

These are the languages of God’s people in the centre, and they carry the good news to the hearts of his children. Across Central Australia, new believers are being baptised and growing in faith. Dozens have received baptism and confirmation, with many in bush communities. God is clearly at work, calling, gathering and renewing his people. Stories like these are why Finke River Mission continues to train and support its pastors and support workers. FRM’s been doing the same for close to 150 years, since humble beginnings in the 1870s. But we’re up against a growing challenge. Finke River Mission receives no ongoing government or denominational funding. Everything we do, from training Indigenous pastors and evangelists to visiting remote communities and running bush Bible courses, is sustained by donations and prayer. Right now, that support is under strain. Expenses are increasing faster than giving, and without an uplift in regular donations, we will need to reduce travel, postpone training visits or slow the translation work that keeps God’s word alive in local languages. Today, 12 Aboriginal Lutheran pastors serve more than 36 communities in the 5 main central Australian language areas. We can only continue this good work with your help. We are deeply thankful for all who already give so faithfully. But the reality is simple: without increased financial support, the work of Finke River Mission cannot continue at its current strength. If you have ever prayed for the people of the Centre, read these stories with joy, or felt moved by the faith of those who serve here, please consider making a donation today.

SCAM ALERT!

PLEASE READ – YOUR AWARENESS CAN PROTECT OUR CHURCH FAMILY!



There is currently a scam circulating in which church members are being contacted by people pretending to be their pastor or another church leader.



These scammers may contact you by **text message, email, phone call** or social media. They may even use the pastor's real name and the name of the church to make the message appear genuine.



They will often claim there is an emergency and ask you to:

- Buy **Apple, Amazon** or other gift cards   
- Send them the gift card numbers or codes
- Electronically transfer money 
- Provide some other form of financial assistance



DO NOT SEND MONEY OR GIFT CARDS

Always verify the person's identity before providing any financial assistance.



A message from Pastor James



I will **NEVER** ask you by text message, email or social media to send money, transfer funds or purchase gift cards for me or for someone else.



I will only contact you by phone using the **phone numbers printed on the back** of our church bulletin.



If someone in our community requires financial assistance, **I will bring the matter to Church Council.**



I will not contact individual church members privately asking them for money – **especially by text, email or social media.**



If you receive a message that appears to be from me asking for money or gift cards:

**DO NOT RESPOND.
DO NOT SEND MONEY. VERIFY FIRST.**



If in doubt, contact me directly using the contact details printed in the church bulletin.



Please also make sure our older or more vulnerable church members are **aware of this scam.**

Growing Together:

Daily Devotions to Help You

Monday: You Are

Matthew 5:13-14: “You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world.”

Notice Jesus’ words: “You are.” He does not say, “Try harder and perhaps you will become salt and light.” Before Jesus tells us what to do, he tells us who we are. We easily turn Christianity into a list: pray more, serve more, forgive faster, make fewer mistakes. But Jesus begins with what he has given us. You belong to him. He has called you, forgiven you and made you his own. Your identity does not rest on how brightly you shone yesterday. It rests in Christ. Perhaps your faith feels small today or you are conscious of your failures. Jesus knows them all, and still speaks his promise: You are his. You are forgiven. You are loved. You are salt. You are light—in the Lord.

Do you think of Christianity first in terms of what you must do or what Christ has done for you?

How might today be different if you began by remembering, “I belong to Jesus”?

Lord Jesus, thank you that I belong to you. Remind me that I am forgiven and loved, and help me live today as someone you have made your own. Amen.

Faith in Action: Begin today by saying: “I belong to Jesus. I am forgiven. I am loved. I am salt. I am light—in the Lord.”

Tuesday: When Our Light Doesn't Shine

Matthew 5:16: “Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.”

Jesus’ words about being light are beautiful, but they also expose us. What have people seen in our lives this week? Perhaps kindness and patience—but perhaps also temper, selfishness or resentment. We speak about grace yet struggle to extend it. We say everyone matters to God yet overlook someone who is lonely. Sometimes the darkness isn't simply around us. It is within us. If our relationship with God depended upon how brightly we shone, none of us could stand. We need forgiveness. And that is why Jesus came. Jesus knows every failure, yet he has not turned away. He went to the cross for sinners—for you. We can bring our darkness to him because the

One who exposes our sin is also the One who died to forgive it.

Where have your words or actions recently failed to reflect the love of Jesus?

What do you need to bring honestly before Jesus and ask his forgiveness?

Merciful Jesus, forgive the ways I have failed to reflect your love. Thank you for the cross and for your mercy that makes me new. Lead me again in your light. Amen.

Faith in Action: Think of one relationship where you haven't reflected Christ's love. Take one small step toward putting things right today.

Wednesday: Light in the Lord

Ephesians 5:8: “For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light.”

Three little words change everything: “In the Lord.” Paul does not tell us to manufacture enough spiritual light to impress God. Jesus is the source. Christ entered our darkness. He came for people burdened by sin, shame and failure. He did not stand outside our broken world shouting, “Try harder to reach me!” He came to us. On the cross, the Light of the World carried our sin and guilt. But darkness did not win. On the third day the tomb was empty. Jesus Christ is risen. His victory is given to you. Your hope is not that you will finally become good enough for God. Your forgiveness, salvation and future rest in Jesus. Even when your faith feels weak, your

Saviour remains strong. You are light—in the Lord.

What changes when you remember that Jesus is the source of your light?

Where do you particularly need Christ's light and hope today?

Risen Lord Jesus, thank you for entering our darkness and overcoming sin and death. When my faith feels weak, turn my eyes to you and fill me with resurrection hope. Amen.

Faith in Action: Notice a light today and remember: Christ is the Light, and darkness has not overcome him. Pray for someone who needs that hope.



Growing Together:

Daily Devotions to Help You

Thursday: Stay Connected to the Source

John 15:5: "Apart from me you can do nothing."

Imagine shouting at an unplugged lamp: "Try harder! Shine brighter!" Nothing happens. Sometimes we treat the Christian life that way. "Be better. Love more. Forgive more. Shine brighter." Eventually we become exhausted trying to produce what only Christ can give. Jesus offers something better. He connects us to himself. He comes through his Word. In Baptism he joins us to himself and gives us his promises. In Holy Communion he feeds us with his body and blood and gives us the forgiveness won upon the cross. God does not wait for us to generate enough spiritual energy to reach him. He comes to us. We receive Christ's forgiveness, grace and life. Then Jesus sends us into ordinary life as salt and light. We don't shine so Jesus will love us. We shine because he already does. Where are you trying to live the Christian life mainly through your own strength?

How does God strengthen you through his Word, Baptism and Holy Communion?

Lord Jesus, keep me connected to you through your Word and Sacraments. Fill me with your forgiveness and grace so that your love may flow through me. Amen.

Faith in Action: Read Matthew 5:13-16 and ask: "What has Jesus given me, and who has he made me to be?"

Friday: Put On Love

Colossians 3:14: "And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

Our clothesline at church offers a simple reminder: Put on love. But where does that love come from? It comes from the cross. Christian love begins not with us trying to become more loving, but with Christ loving us. Jesus welcomed sinners, forgave those who failed him and stretched out his arms upon the cross for us. So "put on love" is not another command to earn God's favour. In Christ, we already have God's love. We put on love because we have first been loved. That changes how we see others. The difficult person is someone Christ loves. The lonely person is someone Christ sees. The person who has failed is someone for whom Jesus died. Putting on love is often wonderfully ordinary: patience, listening, forgiving, encouraging and noticing someone overlooked. Who might God be inviting you to see differently today?

Which is hardest for you: patience, forgiveness, compassion, listening or generosity?

Lord Jesus, thank you for loving me first. Clothe me in your love today and help me share that love with the people you place around me. Amen.

Faith in Action: Choose one person today and deliberately "put on love" toward them through a simple act of kindness, patience or encouragement.

Saturday: A Little Salt, A Little Light

Matthew 5:16: "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

We sometimes imagine that making a difference for God's kingdom requires something enormous. Jesus gives us smaller pictures: a mustard seed, a little yeast, a pinch of salt, a lamp. Being salt and light may mean sitting beside someone who is alone, speaking gently when anger would be easier, saying "I'm sorry," offering forgiveness, or asking, "Can I pray for you?" These things seem tiny. Yet never underestimate what God can do through something small. A little light makes an enormous difference in a dark room. And the glory does not come to us. Jesus says people see our good works and glorify our Father. You don't have to save the world. Jesus already has. A little salt here. A little light there. A little forgiveness, mercy, courage and hope.

Through it, someone may glimpse Jesus. Where has God already placed you to be salt and light?

What small act of love might God use through you this week?

Heavenly Father, let Christ's light shine through my ordinary words and actions. Use even the small things to point others to Jesus. Amen.

Faith in Action: Do one small thing that reflects Jesus' love today. Don't worry about making it impressive. Trust God to use it.

CREATIVE RESPONSE

The prophet Isaiah declared God's intention to make his house a "house of prayer for all nations" (Isaiah 56:7).

Use this creative prayer idea to make your home a 'house of prayer' for others. Pass around a bag or bowl of M&Ms (or equivalent sweet) when your household gathers for prayer. Let each person take a handful, but don't let anyone eat them yet. Explain that the colour of the M&Ms will indicate the direction of your prayers. Lead your household in prayer using this guide:

- For every **red** M&M, pray for a member of your family by name.
- For every **green** M&M, pray for a friend or neighbour.
- For every **orange** M&M, pray for a teacher in your life.
- For every **yellow** M&M, pray for someone in need.
- For every **dark brown** M&M, pray for a leader in your life.
- For every **blue** M&M, pray for Christians in other places.
- For any other colour, offer a prayer of your choice!



ACTION RESPONSE

The Canaanite woman who came to Jesus for help wasn't made very welcome by his disciples (Matt 15:23).

Are newcomers welcomed at your church? What part do you play in welcoming others? Plan a way to make someone who is relatively new to your church feel more at home, or offer to serve as part of your church's greeting/welcoming ministry.
