This week's devotions explore what this means for daily life: trusting Jesus, resting in His mercy, using our gifts and remembering that our hope is not in how tightly we hold onto Jesus, but in the wonderful truth that Jesus holds tightly to us.

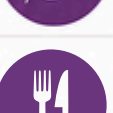

1 SAFER WINDOWS

After a pane of glass broke, the south-side church windows were found not to meet safety standards. Council approved their replacement with safety glass by Glass Solutions

Following extensive investigation and conversations with Assistant Bishop for Mission, Pastor David Schmidt, Council approved UCare as our central congregational database. Privacy, security, access and maintenance processes will be established to support administration, ministry and pastoral care.

286 students in Years 7–12 at Caboolture State High School have returned consent forms to participate in Christian RI.



The school is ready and supportive, with flexibility for RI to be offered weekly or fortnightly.



Four volunteers have responded, but eight more instructors and assistants are needed before the program can begin.



2 WHAT IS CHRISTIAN RI?



Christian Religious Instruction gives students in Queensland state schools the opportunity to question, explore and discover Christian faith and values through the teachings of Jesus.



Lessons encourage students to ask questions, explore personal beliefs and broader worldviews, and discover their own conclusions about faith, values and Christianity.



Christian RI is delivered in a safe, respectful and supportive environment.

Safe Church Training and Church Worker Support resources guide appointments. LCA policies and procedures are followed even when a prospective appointee is well known.

Pastors, leaders, employees and volunteers understand and commit to the LCA Standards of Ethical Behaviour and approved LCA policies and procedures.

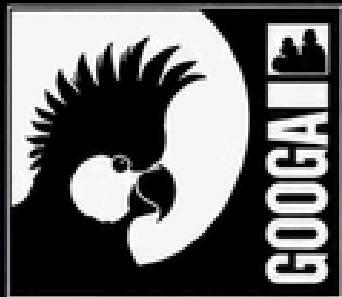

! SCAM ALERT! !

PLEASE READ – YOUR AWARENESS CAN PROTECT OUR CHURCH FAMILY!



There is currently a scam circulating in which church members are being contacted by people pretending to be their pastor or another church leader.



These scammers may contact you by **text message, email, phone call** or social media. They may even use the pastor's real name and the name of the church to make the message appear genuine.



They will often claim there is an emergency and ask you to:

- Buy **Apple, Amazon** or other gift cards   
- Send them the gift card numbers or codes
- Electronically transfer money 
- Provide some other form of financial assistance



DO NOT SEND MONEY OR GIFT CARDS

Always verify the person's identity before providing any financial assistance.



A message from Pastor James



I will **NEVER** ask you by text message, email or social media to send money, transfer funds or purchase gift cards for me or for someone else.



I will only contact you by phone using the **phone numbers printed on the back** of our church bulletin.



If someone in our community requires financial assistance, **I will bring the matter to Church Council.**



I will not contact individual church members privately asking them for money — **especially by text, email or social media.**



If you receive a message that appears to be from me asking for money or gift cards:

**DO NOT RESPOND.
DO NOT SEND MONEY. VERIFY FIRST.**



If in doubt, contact me directly using the contact details printed in the church bulletin.



Please also make sure our older or more vulnerable church members are **aware of this scam.**

Daily Devotions to Help You

Monday: The Question That Changes Everything

Matthew 16:15 “But what about you?” he asked. “Who do you say I am?”

Jesus does not only ask what others believe about Him. He makes the question personal “Who do you say I am?”

Peter answers, “You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.” Jesus is more than a wise teacher or inspiring example. He is God’s promised Saviour, who rescues us from sin and death. Many voices tell us to find our identity in success, possessions, popularity or independence. Yet none of these can forgive our sins or give eternal life.

Only Jesus can. Peter’s confession was not discovered through his own cleverness. God revealed it to him.

Through His Word and Holy Spirit, God also reveals Jesus and gives us faith to trust Him.

Who is Jesus to you?

Which voices compete most strongly for your trust?

Living God, reveal Jesus to me through Your Word and Spirit.

Keep my faith centred upon Him, my Messiah and Saviour. Amen.

Faith in Action: Write, “Jesus is my Messiah and Saviour,” somewhere you will see it today.

Read it whenever another voice challenges your hope.

Tuesday: In View of God’s Mercy

Romans 12:1 “Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God’s mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice.”

Paul’s call to Christian living begins with four important words: “In view of God’s mercy.” He does not say, “In view of how good you have been,” or, “In view of what you have achieved.” Our life with God begins with what He has

done for us. We could not free ourselves from sin, so Jesus came to us. He carried our guilt to the cross and became the once-for-all sacrifice for the world. Through Him we receive forgiveness, life and salvation. We do not worship to make God gracious. We worship because He has shown us grace. We do not serve so that He will love us.

We serve because, in Christ, He already does. Christian service is not anxious repayment.

It is a grateful response to mercy freely received.

When are you tempted to believe that you must earn God’s love?

How does God’s mercy change the way you serve others?

Merciful Father, thank You for loving and forgiving me through Jesus.

Let my life become a joyful response to Your mercy. Amen.

Faith in Action: Before one ordinary task today, pause and say, “I do this in view of God’s mercy.”

Offer it to God with thanks.

Wednesday: Be Transformed

Romans 12:2: “Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”

The world constantly tries to shape us. It says that our value comes from what we achieve, own or contribute. Our sinful nature listens because it wants to place “me” at the centre. Paul does not simply tell us to try harder. He

says, “Be transformed.” God is the One who renews us. Through His Word and Spirit, God reminds us who we are. In Baptism, He joined us to Christ’s death and resurrection and claimed us as His own. Each day He calls us back to repentance, forgiveness and new life. Your achievements do not define you. Your failures do not define you. Jesus

does. Jesus says, “You are forgiven. You are loved. You belong to Me.”

What worldly message most affects how you see yourself?

Which promise of God do you especially need today?

Holy Spirit, renew my mind through God’s Word. Remind me that I am loved, forgiven and claimed by Christ.

Amen.

Faith in Action: When a negative or worldly message shapes your thoughts today,

answer it with this truth: “I belong to Jesus.”



Growing Together:

Thursday: Christ Builds His Church

Matthew 16:18 *“On this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.”*

Sometimes we look at the Church and worry. We see declining attendance, ageing congregations, financial pressure and uncertainty about the future. We wonder whether we are strong enough for the challenges ahead. Jesus gives us a promise: “I will build my church.” Notice who builds the Church. Jesus does. It belongs to Him and rests upon Christ, the crucified and risen Son of God—not upon our strength, creativity or success. Our service still matters, and Jesus calls us to join His work. But we serve with confidence rather than fear because the future is in His hands. Jesus entered death and rose victorious. The grave could not hold Him, and the gates of death will not overcome His Church. Our strength may fail. His promise will not.

What worries do you carry about the Church’s future?

How does Jesus’ promise speak to those concerns?

Lord Jesus, forgive me when fear becomes greater than faith.

Keep Your Church grounded upon You and help me trust Your promise. Amen.

Faith in Action: Pray for your congregation and its leaders.

Thank Jesus for one sign of His continuing work among His people.

Friday: One Body, Many Gifts

Romans 12:5 *“In Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.”*

The Church is not a spectator event where a few people serve while everyone else watches. Paul describes it as one body with many members. We have different gifts, personalities and opportunities. Some teach or lead. Others serve, encourage, give or show mercy. Some ministries are public; others happen quietly over coffee, beside a hospital bed or through faithful prayer. No Christian can say, “I do not matter.” God has given each person a place in Christ’s body. Nor can anyone say, “I do not need others.” We belong to one another. Your gift may seem ordinary, but Christ can use it in His loving work. God does not ask you to be someone else. He invites you to offer faithfully what He has given you.

What gifts or opportunities has God entrusted to you?

Whose gifts have strengthened or encouraged you?

Gracious God, thank You for making me part of Christ’s body.

Help me value others and use my gifts faithfully and joyfully. Amen.

Faith in Action: Use one of your gifts today.

Encourage someone, offer help, pray, give generously or welcome someone who feels overlooked.

Saturday: Jesus Holds Tightly to Us

2 Timothy 2:13 *“If we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself.”*

Peter boldly confessed Jesus as the Messiah, but his faith was not always strong. He misunderstood Jesus and eventually denied knowing Him. Yet Jesus did not let Peter go. Jesus carried Peter’s failure to the cross. After rising from death, He came with forgiveness and restoration. Peter’s hope was not that he always held tightly enough to Jesus. His hope was that Jesus held tightly to him. That is Gospel for us. Some days our faith feels strong; on others it feels weak. We may struggle with doubt, regret, illness, grief or fear. None of these changes Christ’s faithfulness. Our salvation does not rest upon the strength of our grip on Jesus, but upon His loving grip on us. He is our Rock, Redeemer and Saviour—and He will not let us go.

When has your faith felt weak or uncertain?

What comfort comes from knowing that Jesus holds you?

Faithful Jesus, hold me when my faith is weak. Forgive my failures and keep me safely in Your love. Amen.

Faith in Action: Contact someone who may be struggling. Remind them: “Jesus is faithful, and He is holding you.”
